Every year, EQAF brings together high-level speakers in higher education and stakeholders from the HE sector to discuss the latest trends in quality assurance.

Through a mix of plenary and parallel sessions, the 2015 EQAF, entitled “**Taking stock and looking forward**”, will combine presentations of current developments in quality assurance (QA) with discussions on research, policy and practice that will take place in paper sessions and workshops.

2015 marks not only the 10th anniversary of EQAF, but also 10 years since the introduction of the Standards and Guidelines for Quality Assurance in the European Higher Education Area (ESG). With the recent adoption of the revised ESG, this year presents an ideal moment to take stock of the status of European QA policies and assess their impact on all stakeholders. The Forum will examine QA in the EHEA from a variety of perspectives and explore the ways in which concrete practices in institutions and agencies reflect European level policies

The Forum is co-organised by EUA, the European Association for Quality Assurance in Higher Education (ENQA), the European Students’ Union (ESU) and the European Association of Institutions in Higher Education (EURASHE) and aims to create a unique platform for the higher education and QA communities to monitor, shape and anticipate developments in the area.
