- Programme management process is controlled by Study Programme Committee (SPC);
- SPC consists of several academics, at least one student and at least one social partner (5-7 members in total);
- Main responsibilities of SPC:
 - > ensure achievement of intended learning outcomes and their relevance;
 - > competitiveness of study programme;
 - > taking into account notion about study programme of stakeholders and best practice.

Coordinated students' representation






Meaning of coordination

- To provide representatives with information necessary to perform their duties well;
- To receive reports from representatives on their activities;
- To ensure that representatives would perform their defined duties;
- To constantly keep contact with representatives;
- To support representatives whenever possible.



Activities of students' representatives

- In advance, prepared methods increases participation of students' representatives.
